This particular evidence piece is an info-graphic created using an online info-graphic maker called, Piktochart. The info-graphic articulates the pros and cons of two policy approaches to providing 1-1 device ratios for school. The two policies in question were: Bring-Your-Own-Device and Employer-Provided-Device. The original format was a JPG file and upon converting to a PDF, produced the white space around the info-graphic.

While the content of this evidence piece could be loosely related to the OLTD program outcome, " Demonstrate basic competency with design and implementation within a variety of online learning environments and tools," my thinking was of how this content was produced. Before producing this info-graphic, I had never knew about what info-graphics were or how they were constructed. So when I had to create this evidence piece, I relied on the info-graphic maker, Picktochart, to guide my construction of one. Through the online program's examples and guides, I was able to build this evidence piece with a professional look and feel. As such I feel I can now produce more info-graphics using this online tool and could, with more practice, build this into my teaching practice.

The OLTD program outcome, "Demonstrate basic competency with design and implementation within a variety of online learning environments and tools" is the foundation upon which a successful educator builds their course upon. Having knowledge and being able to use a variety of online tools and learning environments will not only allow you to have options when creating course content and building online course environments, but it will also give you the flexibility to adapt to employer requirements/limitations. As well, you will be able to assist students as they attempt to create and innovate using tools that you may include in your course or not. I liken this outcome to the conventional handyman. The educator that is competent in many tools and learning environments will be able to solve most problems students may have and with

some research would be able to solve more specific issues as well. A necessary outcome to continue to develop and build upon.
